Organisations have dealt superbly with the rapid transformation to mass remote working. **As attention turns towards a post-pandemic economic recovery**, the number gearing up for long-term homeworking is greater than we might have imagined a year ago.

of respondents expect up to half their employees to continue working from home in the coming year.

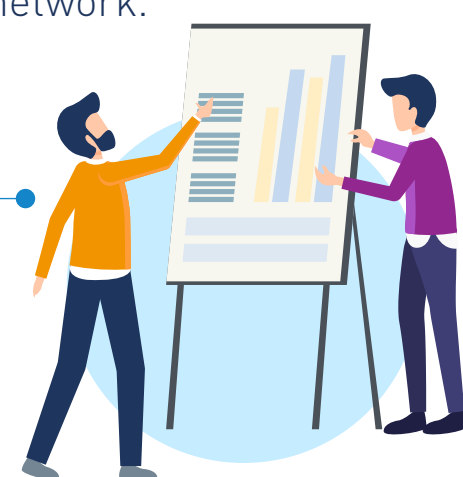


Almost 1 in 4 plan to downsize office space.

Priority areas for optimisation include:

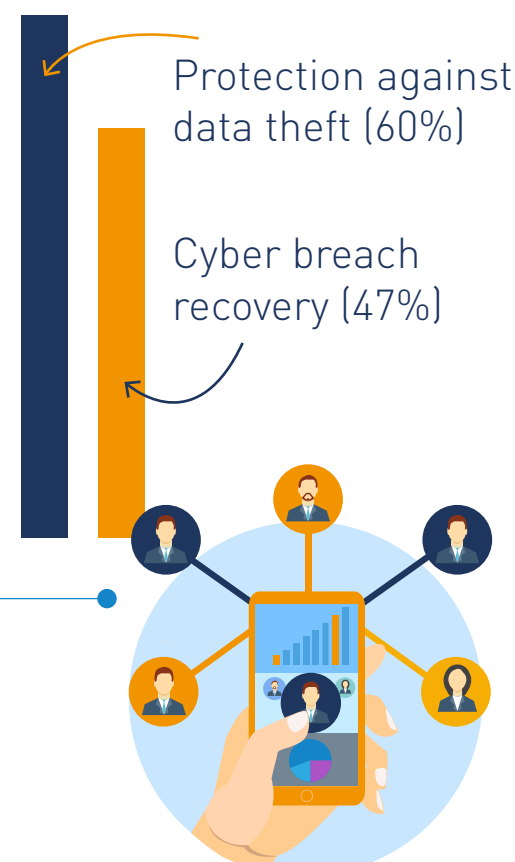
- 40%** Managing cybersecurity risk

Key cybersecurity concerns for homeworking the next 12 months...



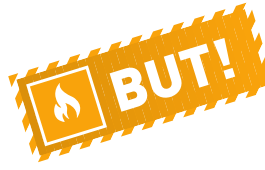

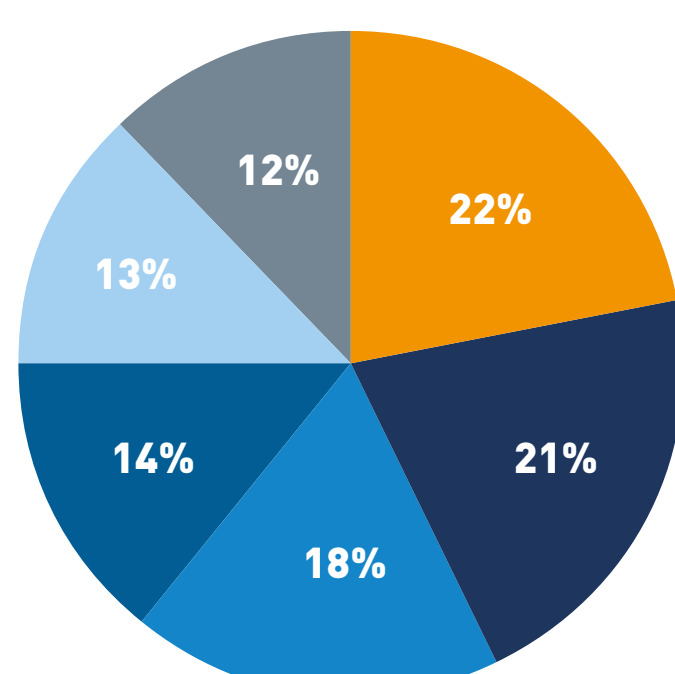
